#### **MINUTES**

## REGULAR MEETING MARCH 3RD, 2020

The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Mayor Fernandez. Those present were, Mayor Pro Tem Cindy Neef, Commissioner Homer Beheler, Commissioner Kathy Fernandez, Commissioner Carol Kim and Commissioner Ed Walker.

### A. Approval of Minutes

The approval of the regular minutes for February 2020 was motioned by Commissioner Carol Kim.

## B. Approval of the Financial Report & Budget Amendment

The approval of the Financial Report for February 2020 was motioned by Commissioner Carol Kim

The approval of Budget Amendment (Attached) to increase - Street (Powell Funds) by \$195, Street (Lights) by \$50, Public Safety by \$6,400 and decrease - General Gov't by \$5,220 and Sanitation by \$1,425 was motioned by Commissioner Kathy Fernandez. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Mayor Pro Tem Cindy Neef. The motion passed.

### C. Audit Presentation - Steve Hackett

#### E. New Lease for Luck's Cannery

The approval of Eastern Steel Works newly composed lease (5 year term, \$75,000 estimated renovation investment) with the Town effective March 15<sup>th</sup>, 2020 was motioned by Commissioner Homer Beheler. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Commissioner Kathy Fernandez. Commissioner Ed Walker recused himself. The motion passed.

### F. Tobacco Free Policy

Mayor Fernandez has been in several meetings with the health department and the county has passed a tobacco free policy. Since we are town planning to host activities with the public, we need to begin discussion about what the Town's tobacco policy needs to be. Allison Johnson and Kendall Phillips with Public Health Department gave a short presentation along with a draft ordinance for review regarding implementing a Tobacco Free Policy in the Town of Seagrove. The health department would also provide any signage needed and offer tobacco cessation resources/classes. We plan to revisit this topic at our next regular meeting to establish the Town's Policy.

#### G. GroundLion Update

Samuel Brown with GroundLion gave an update on the construction progress so far. At the moment, they are approx.... 90% complete with the tap room and have just a few more construction items to go.

Also, GroundLion, along with Carolina Bronze, provided the Mayor and Commissioners with a memorandum stating their objection to Luck's Advisory Board recommendation regarding lease terms offered to Eastern Steel Works. See memorandum attached.

## H. Luck's Cannery Advisory Committee Update & Purchase Approvals

We have received a \$25,000 donation from Thompson Roofing that helped us on renovation of lower level. We have signed contract for plumbing, concrete cutting & French drain, storefronts, and construction of walls for lower section. Mayor Fernandez met with Glass Shop last week and the glass for storefronts has been measured and they are on order.

- -The approval to spend \$49,000 to Cesaro Electric for electrical work in the Luck's Cannery was motioned by Mayor Pro Tem Cindy Neef. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Commissioner Homer Beheler. The motion passed.
- -The approval to spend \$45,984 to Thompson Roofing for replacing roof (includes repair & replace skylights) was motioned by Commissioner Ed Walker. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Mayor Pro Tem Cindy Neef. The motion passed.
- -The approval to spend \$3,000 out of total \$5,200 from David Baker (Carpenter) to add new doors to match architects plan in the Town Hall along with handicap ramp installation was motioned by Commissioner Homer Beheler. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Commissioner Carol Kim. The motion passed.

## I. National Scenic Byway Designation

Right now, with North Carolina, Highway 705 is designated as a scenic byway. Mary Joan Pugh with Randolph County Trail division is working to see if Highway 705 can be designated as a National Scenic Byway. Mayor Fernandez is working with Tourism & Development to put together a proposal to present to Federal Government to get Hwy 705 as a National scenic byway. The Town needs to come up with a maintenance plan and work with other municipalities to achieve this designation. Meetings will commence next week to begin work on the proposal.

### J. Trash on NC 705

Mayor Fernandez is concerned about the amount of trash along NC 705 especially on Seagrove/Robbins exit ramp and the surrounding area. The Mayor, along with Council members are planning to have a trash pickup day this month to clean up the area along the highway and hopes to continue to have regular pickups scheduled in the future.

### **K.** Committee Reports

## Commissioner Kathy Fernandez – Events

More research has been done on the 4<sup>th</sup> of July event. In the past, 7 churches coordinated to put the event together. 2,000 hot dogs and fireworks for approx. \$3,500 were ordered. Plan to check with various churches to see if they are interested in participating in some capacity in hosting this event.

## Commissioner Homer Beheler – Zoning & Events Assist

The approval for Special Event Permit for the Seagrove Fiddler's Convention on March 21<sup>st</sup>, 2020 at the Seagrove Elementary School Gym was motioned by Mayor Pro Tem Cindy Neef. 2<sup>nd</sup> by Commissioner Carol Kim. The motion passed.

## Commissioner Cindy Neef – Beautification

## Commissioner Ed Walker - Streets

Contacted Steve Williamson to do some paving repair around town. Went to various areas and marked with spray paint and took photos to send to Steve. There are about 20 locations that would need some repair.

## Commissioner Carol Kim – Finance

Planning to work with Kathryn to start planning for budget for the next fiscal year 2020-2021. Plan to approve next year's budget at the Regular Meeting in May 2020.

As current, and initial lessees, GroundLion Brewing Co. and Carolina Bronze **object strongly** to the lease terms recommended for offer to Eastern Steel Works (ESW) by the Lucks Advisory Board. We believe that the lease terms offered to ESW are not in the long-term fiscal interest of the town, and set an unfair precedent in regard to existing tenants.

# Objection based on the long-term fiscal interests of Seagrove:

Both GroundLion Brewing Co. and Carolina Bronze received and accepted lease offers at a rate of \$0.11 per square foot per month. The terms of both leases specify that improvements or repairs to the leased space will be done by the tenant's, at their expense, and that the lessor (Town of Seagrove) will provide rent abatement for such improvements or repairs. These lease terms put the burden of expense for repairs, improvements, and the subsequent maintenance onto the tenant. At the end of the current lease term the town can negotiate changes in the lease rate to ensure that they (the town) can afford to maintain the premises in their improved state for future tenants. Both initial lessees agreed to these terms because it served the common interests of both parties.

The Lucks Advisory Board met on February 13, 2020 to discuss the lease offer that would be recommended to this Council for a new lessee, ESW. The terms of such offer had been determined and shared with ESW prior to the meeting and are substantially the same as the terms in the current leases with GroundLion Brewing Co. and Carolina Bronze; that is \$0.11 per square foot per month. As previously noted, the \$0.11 rate assumes that the tenant will bare the costs of repair or improvement. In the case of ESW, however, they are leasing space that has been previously improved significantly, and at the town's expense. Though the offered rate was adjusted up to \$0.118/square foot/month, it in no way prepares the town to maintain those improvements in the future, nor does it obligate ESW to compensate the town for such improvements during the term of the lease.

It is fiscally irresponsible for the town to lease improved space at the same rate as unimproved space. Improved space has a different value than unimproved space, even within the same building footprint. The town spent multiple thousands of dollars to replace the roof over the space ESW is interested in leasing and those improvements are
