

Public Hearing Town of Seagrove Speed Limits

October 4th, 2016

Mayor David Fernandez opened the Public Hearing at 7:30 with a statement of concerns from some of the citizens of the Town of Seagrove about speed limit concerns. The majority of the concerns have come in referencing Ridge Road, South Street, East Street, and down through town. Right before the meeting got started the Mayor was given an example of a speeding ticket showing 60 MPH in a 35 MPH.

Mayor Fernandez had spoken with DOT Dave Willett in Carthage concerning the state maintained routes of 220 and 705 within the Town of Seagrove. He recommended trying to do some things within Town limits to slow people down (such as speed bumps) because the state of North Carolina has state specific speed limits for state routes.

Commissioner Cindy Neef made a motion to change the speed limits within the Town's authority from 35 MPH to 20 MPH and Commissioner Jason Auman 2nd the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

Mayor David Fernandez requested Commissioner Jason Auman to have new speed limit signs made and possibly a sign that has the wording "City Speed Limit 25 Unless Otherwise Posted".






